Our volunteer surgeons provided orthopedic surgery to 87 individuals.

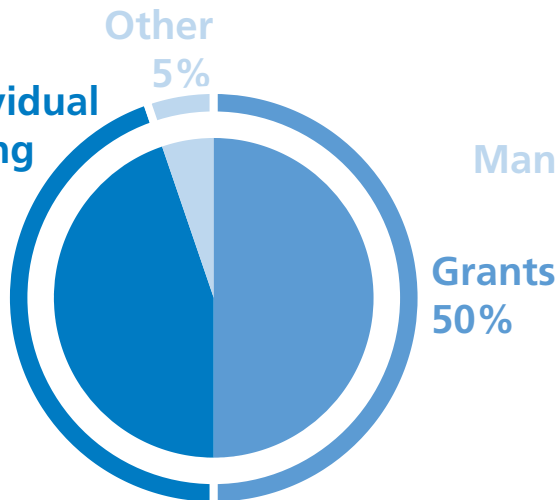
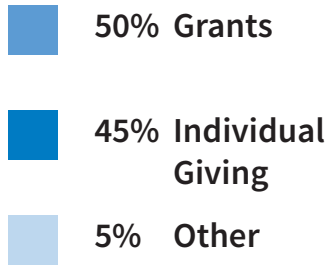


Mobility Outreach International provided 339 individuals with a limb or brace.

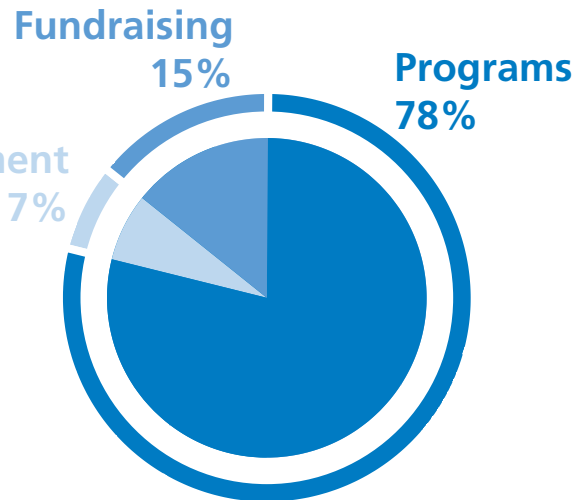
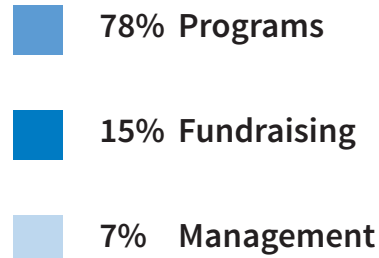

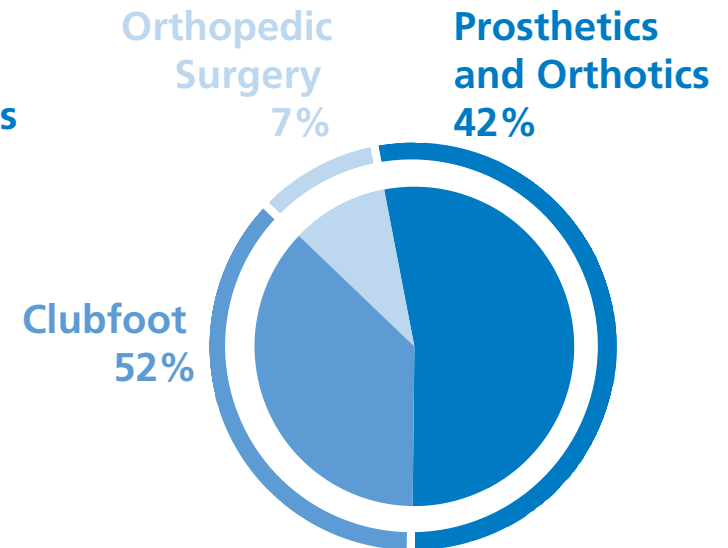
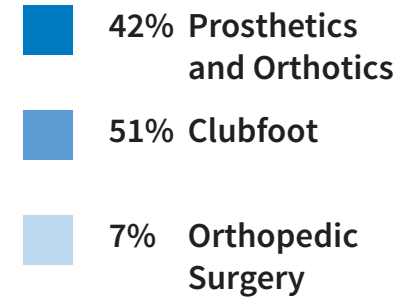
Revenue \$1,196,163

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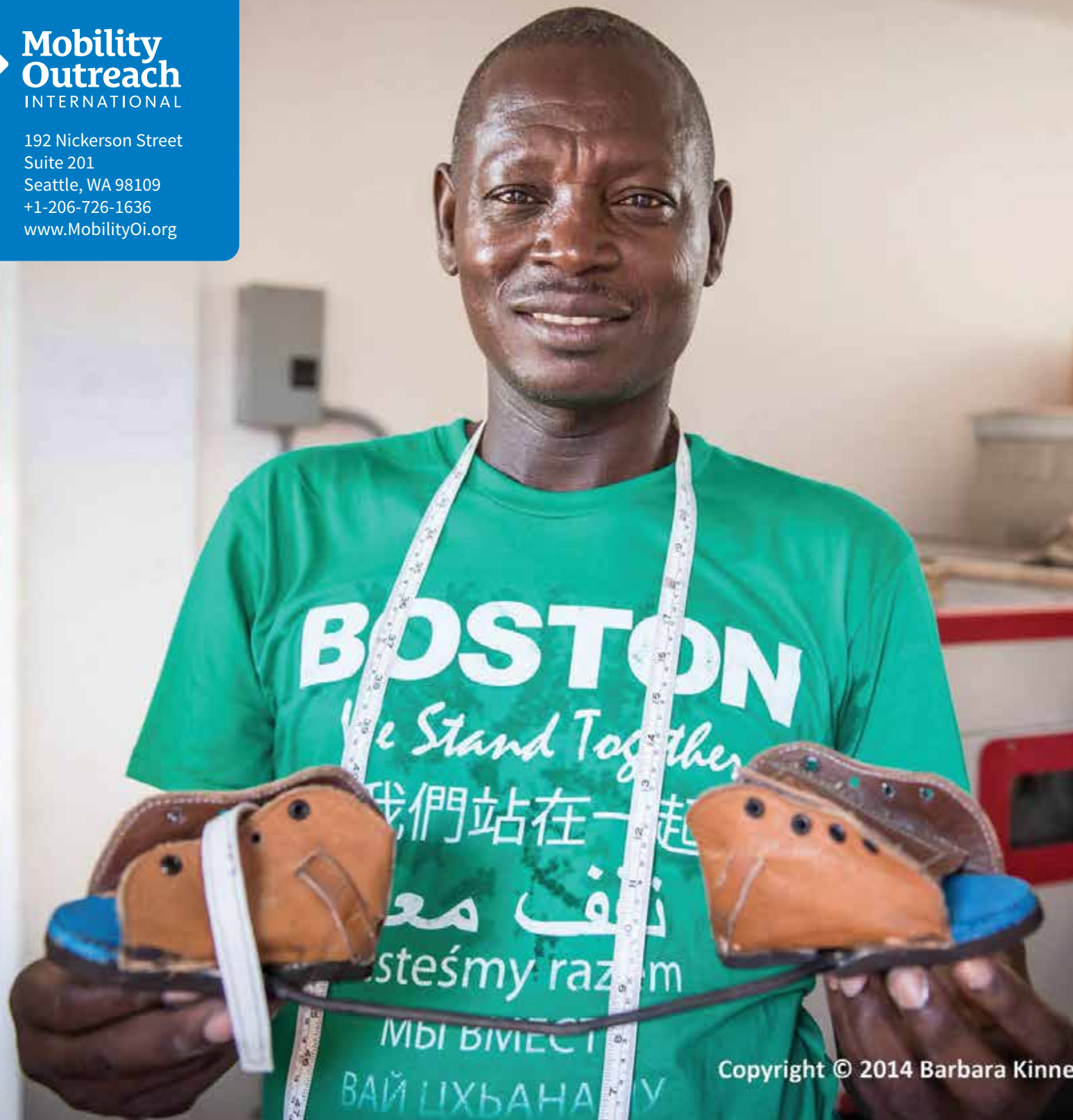
